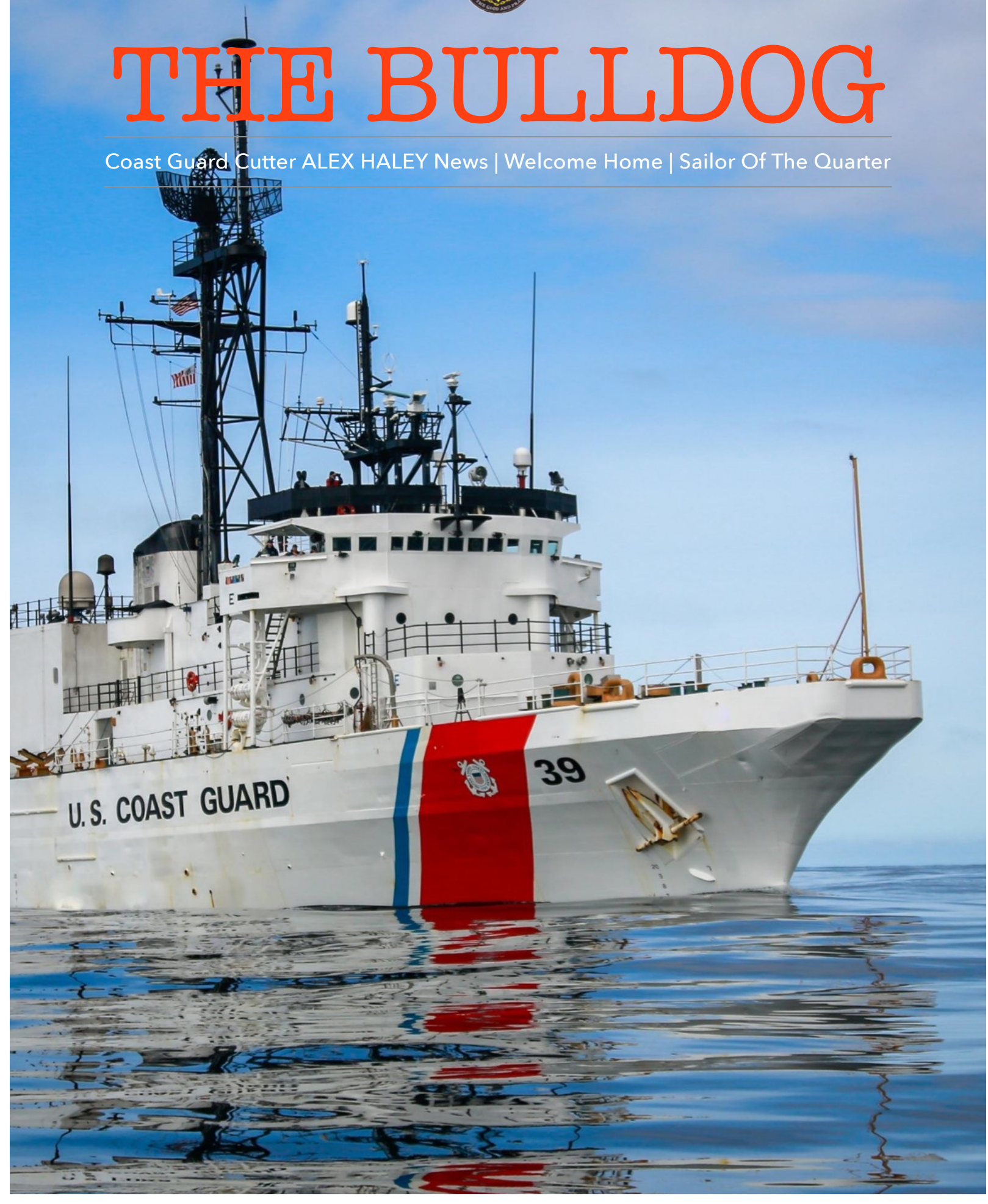

Returning Home - Press Release

KODIAK, Alaska - The crew of Coast Guard Cutter ALEX HALEY is scheduled to return to Kodiak on Wednesday morning following a successful 68 day deployment, having patrolled more than 12,000 miles throughout the Bering Sea and Aleutian Islands. ALEX HALEY, known as the "Bulldog of the Bering", departed Kodiak in July and has spent the last two months conducting operations in the Bering Sea and the Aleutian Islands. During the deployment, ALEX HALEY's crew performed more than forty at-sea domestic fisheries enforcement boardings, four search and rescue cases and one rescue and assistance operation.

ALEX HALEY's presence throughout this patrol proved to be a vital component for search and rescue in the Bering Sea, in the waters off Nome, and off the Aleutian Islands. While in vicinity of Nunivak Island, ALEX HALEY was able to deploy a rescue and assistance crew who arduously worked through the night and in difficult conditions to dewater and refloat a sunken skiff. The crew of the skiff had traveled over 70 miles from mainland Alaska to Nunivak Island to fish during a favorable weather window. While moored in Nome, ALEX HALEY launched her small boat into Norton Sound to take a distressed vessel in tow, returning it and the family onboard safely back to shore. In vicinity of Unalaska Island, the embarked

MH-65D Dolphin helicopter was able to conduct two separate medevacs on both an injured fisherman and injured cargo vessel crewman. The MH-65D transferred both patients safely to Dutch Harbor. In total, five lives were saved through the use of ALEX HALEY's small boat and the embarked helicopter from Air Station Kodiak.

The residents of Nome and the crew of ALEX HALEY capped a great day with BBQ and a Coast Guard Day cake. In Adak, ALEX HALEY was able to assist local

USCGC ALEX HALEY is a 282 ft Medium Endurance Cutter that has been home-ported in Kodiak since 1999. ALEX HALEY routinely conducts operations in the Bering Sea, Aleutian Islands, and the Gulf of Alaska. The cutter's ability to operate in extreme weather conditions provides the mission flexibility necessary to perform search and rescue, fishery law enforcement and vessel safety missions across Alaska. These operations occur under the tactical control of the 17th Coast Guard District in Juneau. The 17th Coast Guard District encompasses the entire state of Alaska, as well as the coastal and offshore waters seaward over several thousands of miles.

Operationally, the crew of 6503 completed a medevac of an injured crewman from the Motor Vessel LOWLANDS MAINE to Dutch Harbor and positively identified an incursion of the Maritime Boundary Line by a foreign fishing vessel. During a training exercise near Dutch Harbor, 6503 successfully delivered the city's Emergency Towing System from shore to the decks of MV SEA TRADER.
