

## **CAPT Robert S. Mohr**

*United States Coast Guard*



Captain Rob Mohr recently completed Senior Service School at National Defense University's Eisenhower School and earned a Master's of Science degree in National Resource Strategy.

Before attending the Eisenhower School, Captain Mohr served as the Surface Forces Logistics Center's Icebreaker, Buoy and Construction Tender Product Line Manager based in Baltimore, Maryland. As Product Line Manager, he led a geographically dispersed team to plan and execute depot and casualty maintenance and provide engineering and logistical support to 86 cutters and 29 barges with an average age of 55-years old.

Captain Mohr is a permanent cutterman with over ten years of sea service. His shipboard assignments were as Student Engineer aboard U.S. Coast Guard Cutter (USCGC) DURABLE (WMEC 628) in St. Petersburg, Florida; Damage Control Assistant aboard USCGC RESOLUTE (WMEC 620); Executive Officer aboard USCGC PADRE (WPB 1328) in Key West, Florida; Executive Officer aboard USCGC ADAK (WPB 1333) permanently stationed in Bahrain in the Arabian Gulf for Operation ENDURING FREEDOM; Engineer Officer aboard USCGC RUSH (WHEC 723) in Honolulu, Hawaii; Executive Officer aboard USCGC TAHOMA (WMEC 908) in Kittery, Maine; and Commanding Officer aboard USCGC DILIGENCE (WMEC 616) in Wilmington, North Carolina. He led DILIGENCE through six patrols in the Caribbean Sea, Gulf of Mexico, and Eastern Pacific during his two years in command. The crew detained 14 suspected smugglers, seized over 2,730 kilograms of cocaine valued at \$82 million, and provided direct humanitarian response following the landfall of hurricanes FLORENCE and MICHAEL.

Captain Mohr's other shore assignments were as a Port Engineer at Naval Engineering Support Unit (NESU) New Orleans. He managed depot-level maintenance aboard Aids to Navigation vessels throughout the vast Coast Guard District Eight. He also served as the Naval Engineering Workforce and Policy Manager for the Office of Naval Engineering (CG-45). He provided resources, information, and tools to ensure maximum professional development, career opportunities, and promotion potential for 530 officers and was also responsible for reviewing and developing all Naval Engineering policy documents, including the Naval Engineering Manual.

Captain Mohr is a native of Woodstock, NY. He graduated from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy in 2000 with a degree in Naval Architecture & Marine Engineering. He also earned dual Master of Science Degrees in Naval Architecture & Marine Engineering and Mechanical Engineering from the University of Michigan.

Captain Mohr's military decorations include the Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medal, Commendation Medal, the Coast Guard Achievement Medal, and the Commandant's Letter of Commendation Ribbon Bar, along with other team and unit awards. He and his wife, Caryla, have three children – Avery, Ayden, and Gideon.
