Master Chief Monti is a 28-year veteran of the U.S. Coast Guard (CG), and currently serves as the Command Master Chief of CG Air Station San Francisco. As Command Master Chief, he advises Captain Christopher Huberty, the Commanding Officer of Air Station San Francisco, on issues and initiatives pertaining to morale, welfare, job satisfaction, discipline, utilization, and training of enlisted personnel.

Master Chief Monti is a native of Merrill, Wisconsin and a 1992 graduate of Merrill HS. After graduation he went on to attend Madison Area Technical College for two years where he studied graphic design. After witnessing a Search and Rescue mission off the coast of Florida in 1994 Eric made the decision to enlist in the CG and graduated Coast Guard Basic Training in December of 1994.



Most recently Master Chief Monti completed his assignment as the Leading Chief Petty Officer of CG Air Station Atlantic City, NJ and National Capital Region Air Defense Facility, Washington DC. While there he managed personnel and logistics schedules in support of the unit's high priority National Capital Region and Presidential Deployable Rotary Wing Air intercept missions.

Other aviation assignments include Assistant Leading Chief, C-130 shop Chief, and quality assurance inspector at CG Air Station Barbers Point, HI; Quality Assurance inspector and Unit Corrosion Program Manager (UCPM) at CG Air Station Kodiak, AK; HC-130H Dropmaster, Sensor System Operator, and UCPM at CG Air Station Sacramento, CA; HU-25 Falcon Jet Dropmaster, Quality Assurance inspector and UCPM at CG Air Station Corpus Christi, TX; HU-25 Falcon Jet Dropmaster and Quality Assurance inspector at CG Air Station Miami, FL.

Eric attended & graduated Aviation Maintenance Technician "A" school in June of 1999. Prior to that he was stationed at small boat Station Two Rivers, WI and the USCGC Mobile Bay based out of Sturgeon Bay, WI.

Master Chief is a graduate of the CG Senior Enlisted Leadership Course and CG Chief Petty Officer Academy (Class 205). He is currently working toward a Bachelor of Arts degree in Human Resource Management from American Military University.
