- Annual Operating Budget: \$4.1M total annual funds (for Sector and sub-units)
- Over 780 Active Duty, Reserve, and Civilian personnel
- Over 600 Coast Guard Auxiliary Volunteers Responsible for 3,500 square miles of waterways including the Strait of Juan de Fuca, Puget Sound and inland waters extending eastward including Idaho and Montana.

In Calendar Year 2019, Sector Puget Sound:

- ✓ Coordinated 1,117 multi-mission incidents, including 481 SAR cases, saving and assisting 590 lives and \$1.2 Million in property.
- ✓ Processed over 3,000 orders for contingency response, temporary duty and PCS travel.
- ✓ Managed Puget Sound Vessel Traffic with nearly 220,000 vessel movements and 25 interventions to maintain navigational safety.
- ✓ Conducted 1,516 security, recreational boating safety, and fisheries boarding's, 91 military vessel escorts, and 361 Ferry Security Operations.
- ✓ Provided waterside support for 3 military outloads, 1 protest event in Seattle Fleet Week and Sea Fair.
- ✓ Responded to 527 reports of pollution.
- ✓ Expended \$379,437 in federal funds to clean up 17 oil and HAZMAT incidents.
- ✓ Conducted 2,018 commercial vessel inspections and examinations.



<u>Sector Organization</u>

A Coast Guard Sector is a shore-based operational unit responsible for the execution of all Coast Guard missions within its Area of Responsibility (AOR). The Sector Commander works as Captain of the Port, Federal Maritime Security Coordinator, Federal On-Scene Coordinator, Officer-in-Charge of Marine Inspection, and Search and Rescue Mission Coordinator. The Sector organization directly supports the Sector Commander in these duties and in the execution of the full range of Coast Guard missions, including Maritime Safety, Maritime Security, Protection of Natural Resources, Maritime Mobility, and National Defense.

Joint Operations

Sector Puget Sound works closely with other Coast Guard units in the Puget Sound area including the Marine Safety and Security Team (MSST) Seattle and Marine Force Protection Unit (MFPU) Bangor.

Sector Puget Sound also coordinates operations with other government agencies including but not limited to: Customs and Border Protection, Transportation Security Administration, Federal Bureau of Investigation, Department of Defense, U. S. Navy, Washington State Patrol, Washington State Ferry System, Washington State Department of Ecology, and various City, County and Port Police/Sheriff and Fire Departments.

Sector Puget Sound Facts

- Sector Puget Sound's vast geographic Area of Responsibility (AOR) adjacent to the Canadian border includes 10 ports and 12 counties with commercial maritime interests.

- Sector Puget Sound's AOR includes the three major commercial shipping ports of Seattle, Everett, and Tacoma. These three ports combined make up the 3rd largest shipping port in the U.S.

- Sector Puget Sound Domestic Vessel Inspectors examine 23 Washington State Ferries, the largest ferry system in the U. S., which transport nearly 25 million ferry passengers a year.

- Sector Puget Sound's Vessel Traffic Center is the largest in the U.S. and is a key traffic center in the Cooperative Vessel Traffic Service (C-VTS) shared between U.S. and Canada. Sector Puget Sound's VTS includes 3,500 square miles of waterways and supports over 218,000 annual vessel transits.
