Mission Execution:

- The largest Level I, Category I, Port, Waterways and Coastal Security Boat Station on the West Coast. Like most other Coast Guard boat stations, we maintain a 24/7 readiness for maritime search and rescue, law enforcement and maritime environmental response. The station also provides small boat escorts/security for U.S. Naval vessel and High Capacity Passenger Vessels, the largest passenger ferry service in the country, and supplies fixed security zone enforcement for military out-load operations in support of OPERATION ENDURING FREEDOM. In addition, Station Seattle serves as the primary support vehicle for Sector Puget Sound's boarding teams that ensure the safety and security of the over 1,000 deep draft vessels that transit the expansive port complex throughout Puget Sound.
- Supports SEAFAIR/Fleet Week events, the largest maritime event in Pacific NW (1/2 million spectators/boaters), as well as Annual Seattle Maritime Festival, and Annual Seattle Yacht Club Opening Day.

Key Interagency Partnerships:

Works with various port partners during law enforcement and search and rescue cases, including FBI, ICE, CBP and the Counter Drug Task Force, as well as state, county, tribal and local first responders.
