LCDR Bradford's personal awards include the Joint Service Commendation Medal, Coast Guard Commendation Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Coast Guard Achievement Medal, Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal, Marine Corps Combat Action Ribbon, Iraq Campaign Medal, and Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal.
